Nursing Care Plan (NCP)

Is the full range of nursing interventions prescribed? Do the nursing interventions reflect a level professional knowledge expected of the student concerned? Nursing evaluation Nursing evaluation is systematic and ongoing, and measures how well the patient has achieved the goals/outcomes specified in the care plan The evaluation identifies
